The Library is proud to serve Mulvane through outreach programming as well. Staff members provided information at the Chamber's Back to School Event, the school open houses at Munson and the Grade School, daycares, high school clubs, the Chamber Halloween Event, storytimes at Munson, and more! In 2024, the Library continued to promote its programs and services through a monthly spot on KAKE TV's morning show too. The Library also delivered and loaned books on a rotating basis to the Middle and High School Libraries, Maria Court, and Quad County Manor.

In addition to outreach and programming, the Library provided faxing, copying, tech assistance, test proctoring, free notary, display space for local artists, meeting room space for non-profits, a home delivery service (drop-off of books to the sick/elderly), and museum passes/activity vouchers (called Community Explorers) for checkout.

Personnel:

The Library had staffing changes in 2024. Stephanie Daniel was welcomed on staff as Assistant Director, and sadly, Janice Aldrich retired after serving the community as a Library Assistant for 5 years.

As always, the Mulvane Public Library strives to provide increasingly diverse and quality services, so the staff were encouraged to attend professional meetings, trainings, and conferences. Specifically, staff attended trainings and webinars on



topics such as customer service, reader's advisory, censorship, handling pest problems in library facilities, technology, cataloging, programming, and many more. All staff members traveled to the Manhattan Public Library and Salina Public Library to explore their spaces, resources, and

services. Additionally, 5 staff members were able to attend the Kansas Library Association (KLA) Conference held in Wichita. In 2024, the Library had representation at the Mulvane Early Childhood Advisory Board meetings, KLA Board meetings, Mulvane Downtown Business meetings, and the Information Network of Kansas meetings. The Director also served on the KLA Board in the final year of her 4-year term, including one as President. Our Youth Program Coordinator, Victoria Fleming, served on the Mulvane Early Childhood Committee. The Mulvane Public Library is extremely proud of its professional library presence as it stands as a clear role model to other area public libraries.

The Mulvane Public Library continued to be governed by an amazing group of Trustees in 2024: President Sara Erb, Vice President Kallie Kimble, Secretary Janine Wollenberg, Treasurer Mandy Roderick, Tyler Miranda, Joel Pile, and Rachal Harper. Outgoing Board Members were Danielle Fells and Charlie Morgan. These volunteers actively promote and support the Library and its services year-round.

Other volunteers in 2024 included a group of local dedicated adults and teens. The volunteers worked an estimated total of 417 hours for the Library. These volunteers assisted in numerous projects throughout the year, including the Summer Reading Program, Back to

School Block Party, and Polar Express Event, but many also helped shelve books weekly.

In order to help promote and fund special programs and projects, the Library also has a Friends of the Library Group. In 2024, Nancy Armstrong served as President, Joan Martinez as Secretary, and Kristina Reed as Treasurer. The group was able to participate in the Kansas Star Casino's Trees of Hope, sell picnic blankets, t-shirts, and tumblers as a group fundraiser, hold a Used Book Sale, and decorate a window for Old Settlers. With some of the money they fundraised, the group supported the Library by funding the pool rental for the Summer Reading Program and maintaining the fish tank for the youth area.
