

# Mulvane Public Library Annual Report for 2022

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The year of 2022 was one of growth and renewed connections. The community returned to traditional in-person library programming and services, while still utilizing the digital and outdoor spaces they had come to love. The usage stats were just under those of 2019, which was especially apparent with the storytime and afterschool crowds.

## Programs, Outreach, and Services:

Library programming in 2022 returned to primarily in-person with many still being held outdoors because of the amazing green space. The Library's programs included:

The Library is proud to serve Mulvane through outreach programming as well. Staff members provided information at the Chamber's Back to School Event, all of the school open houses, daycares, high school clubs, the Women's Club, Chamber Halloween Event, and more! In 2022, the Library began promoting its programs and services through a monthly spot on KAKE TV's morning show too. The Library also continues to deliver and loan books on a rotating basis to the Middle and High School Libraries, Maria Court, and Quad County Manor. In addition to outreach and programming, the Library continues to provide faxing,

copying, tech assistance, book-a-librarian appointments, test proctoring, free notary, display space for local artists, meeting room space for nonprofits, a Homebound Service (drop-off of books to the sick/elderly), and museum passes/activity vouchers (called Community Explorers) for checkout.

## Personnel:

The Library had big staffing changes in early 2022. Sadly, Assistant Director Elizabeth



Thornton, a familiar face having worked at the Library for 13+ years, resigned due to on-going health issues. Additionally, our Adult/Teen Program Coordinator Maggie Pinnick moved back to her home state of Indiana to be closer to family. However, the Library was extremely lucky to fill these two positions with candidates who both possess their Masters of Library Science. Sara Moesel, formerly a librarian with Wichita Public Libraries, filled the Assistant Director position. Larissa Ester, a local Mulvane graduate, who had recently moved back to the area filled the Adult/Teen Program Coordinator position.

As always, the Mulvane Public Library strives to provide increasingly diverse and quality services, so the staff were encouraged to attend professional meetings, trainings, and conferences. Specifically, staff attended in-person trainings on serving patrons with autism and how to detect and manage bullying, and numerous webinars on topics such as customer service, reader's advisory, handling patron complaints, technology, cataloging, programming, and many more. Additionally, 6 staff members were able to attend the in-person Kansas Library Association (KLA) Conference in Wichita, with two of them acting as presenters. In 2022, the Library had representation at the Early Childhood Advisory Board meetings, Kansas Library Association Educational Foundation Board meetings, KLA Board meetings, and Mountain Plains Library Association Board meetings. The Director, Shanna Smith-Ritterhouse, received grant funding to attend a leadership workshop through the Kansas Leadership Center (3<sup>rd</sup> course) and partial funding to attend the regional Mountain Plains Library Association (MPLA) Conference out-of-state. The Director also served on the KLA and MPLA Boards. In late 2022, Shanna became President of the Kansas Library Association. The Presidential term will last a year, and responsibilities include representing Kansas libraries and addressing state-wide issues on the subject when needed. The new Adult/Teen Program Coordinator, Larissa, also served on the KLA Board as webmaster last year, and will continue to do so. Our Youth

Program Coordinator, Victoria Fleming, served on the Mulvane Early Childhood Committee and Let's Move in Libraries Interest Group. She was also able to attend the Association for Library Services to Children Conference in Kansas City. The Mulvane Public Library is extremely proud of its professional library presence as it stands as a clear role model to other area public libraries.

The Mulvane Public Library continued to be governed by a stellar group of Trustees in 2022: President Joan Martinez, Vice President Sara Erb, Secretary Danielle Fells, Treasurer Charlie Morgan, Kallie Kimble, Mandy Roderick, and Janine Wollenberg (Pamela Bruce served part of the year). These volunteers actively promote and support the Library and its services year-round.

Other volunteers in 2022 included the local chapter of Mormon missionaries and a few local teens. The volunteers worked a total of over 210 hours for the Library. These volunteers assisted in numerous projects throughout the year, including the Summer Reading Program, but many also helped shelve books weekly.

In order to help promote and fund special programs and projects, the Library also has a Friends of the Library Group. In 2022, Nancy Armstrong served as President, Joan Martinez as Secretary, and Barbara Banzet as Treasurer. The group was able to participate in the Kansas Star Casino's Trees of Hope, sell picnic blankets, t-shirts, and tumblers as a group fundraiser, hold a Used Book Sale, decorate a window for Old Settlers, and provide library information at Jane's Landing. With some of the money they fundraised, the group supported the Library by funding the pool rental and equipment for teen gaming for a total of \$899.

#### Future:

The Library will continue to prioritize programming, partnerships, outreach, and being present in the community. Additionally, in 2023 the Mulvane Public Library would like to begin an update to the digital branch, the website. While patrons have embraced returning to the physical space, there are many who developed an increasing reliance on our web presence and digital resources during Covid, and we want to continue to serve them to the best of our abilities as well.
