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It was another challenging year for the Mulvane Public Library, largely due to the ongoing presence of Covid. However, the Library continued to offer quality core services, which included all-ages programming, access to technology, community outreach, and lending of both physical and digital materials. While being cautious and considerate of our patrons' health and safety, the Library was delighted to see steady increases in usage and attendance throughout the year. A key element of 2021 was outdoor programming, which allowed many families to comfortably return to in-person events. The Library feels very lucky to have such a welcoming outdoor green space!

## Programs, Outreach, and Services:

Library programming in 2021 was varied in format; some being virtual, outdoors, or inside with masks. The Library adapted to the audience with wellness and comfort in mind. The Library's programs included:

- 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten (on-going reading program for 0-5 year olds) \*
- K5 Club on Tuesdays (activities for grades k-5) \*
- Spark Zone on Thursdays (activities for grades 4-6) \*

- Read to Barney the Therapy Dog (summertime sessions for early readers) \*
- Teen Time Wednesdays (activities for teens) \*
- Teen Special Event- Disney Villian's Ball

The Library is proud to serve Mulvane through outreach programming as well. Staff members provided information at the Chamber's Back to School Event and all of the school open houses, and continues to deliver books on a rotating basis to the Middle and High School Libraries, Maria Court, and Quad County Manor. During the Kansas Reads to Preschoolers Week, our youth coordinator also provided storytimes at the Munson Primary School.

In addition to outreach and programming, the Library continues to provide faxing, copying, tech assistance, book-a-librarian appointments, test proctoring, free notary, display space for local artists, meeting room space for non-profits, a Homebound Service (drop-off of books to the sick/elderly), and museum passes/activity vouchers (called Community Explorers) for checkout.

#### Personnel:

The Mulvane Public Library strives to provide increasingly diverse and quality services, so the staff was encouraged to attend professional meetings, trainings, and conferences (many of them were still virtual in 2021). Specifically, the staff all took an in-person field trip this summer to visit 7 neighboring libraries, and in the fall, attended an in-person training on serving LGBTQ patrons. Additionally, numerous staff members were able to attend the in-person Kansas Library Conference in Wichita, with two of them acting as presenters. In 2021, the Library had representation at the Wichita Area Library Association meetings, Parents as



Teachers meetings, Kansas Library Association Educational Foundation Board meetings, Kansas Public Library Association meetings, and Mountain Plains Library Association meetings. Again, the Director received grant funding to attend a leadership workshop through the Kansas Leadership Center (2<sup>nd</sup> course). The Director, Shanna Smith-Ritterhouse, also served on the Kansas Library Association (KLA) and Mountain Plain Library Association (MPLA) Boards. In 2021 and through 2022, Shanna serves as Vice President for the Kansas Library Association and will serve as President in 2023. The Adult Program Coordinator,

Maggie Pinnick served on the Boards of the Wichita Area Library Association, the Collaborative Summer Library Program, and the Kansas Library Association Education Foundation. The Youth Program Coordinator, Victora Fleming served on the Mulvane Early Childhood Committee and Let's Move in Libraries Interest Group. The Mulvane Public Library is extremely proud of its professional library presence as it stands as a clear role model to other area public libraries. The Mulvane Public Library continued to be governed by a stellar group of Trustees in 2021: President Joan Martinez, Vice President Sara Erb, Secretary Danielle Fells, Treasurer Charlie Morgan, Pamela Bruce, Kallie Kimble, and Mandy Roderick (Merle McKee and Dianne Fleming served part of the year). These volunteers actively promote and support the Library and its services year-round.

Other volunteers in 2021 included the local chapter of Mormon missionaries and a few local teenagers. They worked a total of 112 hours for the Library. These volunteers assisted in numerous projects throughout the year, but also helped shelve books weekly.



In order to help promote and fund special programs and projects, the Library also has a Friends of the Library Group. In 2021, Nancy Armstrong served as President, Donna Fells as Vice President, Joan Martinez as Secretary, and Monica McDaniel as Treasurer. Despite the continued pandemic, the group was able to participate in the Kansas Star Casino's Trees of Hope, sell picnic blankets as a group fundraiser, hold a Flash Used Book Sale, decorate a window for Old Settlers, and host a t-shirt fundraiser for a sick library employee.

#### Future:

As patrons and the community become more comfortable with the new normal, living with Covid, the Library's goal is to rebuild usage and programming to 2019 levels. This means more emphasis will be placed on partnerships, outreach, and being present throughout the community. We want people to get excited about learning new things, meeting new people, and forming connections with their Library and community!
