- **Book Clubs.** Books with Spice will discuss *Tangled Up in You* by Christina Lauren on Thursday, July 17th, at 6:30pm in the large conference room. Fiction and Friends will discuss *The Hazelbourne Ladies Motorcycle and Flying Club* by Helen Simonson on Tuesday, July 22nd, at 6:30pm in the multipurpose room (*Date change due to scheduling conflict!). Books with Bite will discuss *DallerGut Dream Department Store* by Lee Mi-ye on Thursday, August 14th, at 6:30pm at Pizza John's (Derby).
- Social Media Book Club. The Library also hosts a social media book club each month. It focuses on non-fiction (Facebook), and the current title is *The Sound of a Wild Snail Eating* by Elizabeth Tova Bailey.
- Summer Storytimes. Victoria is holding storytimes on Tuesdays at 10:30am and Fridays at 10:30am/11:30am during the Summer Reading Program. Tuesdays are geared towards preschool aged children and Fridays are for the littlest ones. In between Friday's storytimes there is the Chat & Play Cafe, a playtime for tots while parents and caregivers mingle. *Regular session Preschool Storytimes on Wednesdays at 10:30am will resume on July 23rd.
- Summer Discover & Play. During the Summer Reading Program, this session takes place from 11am-12pm following the summer storytime on Tuesdays. *Regular session Discover & Play on Tuesdays at 10:30am will resume on Tuesday, July 22nd.
- Weekly Crafts. Crafts for children and teens are available weekly.
- Paws and Read. Join Lori and her dogs and cats for our Paws and Read program! Children can practice their reading skills with trained therapy dogs. Studies have shown that children who read to dogs improve their reading skills and confidence! During the summer, the therapy animals are available on Wednesdays at 10:30am
- **Family Storytime.** This storytime falls on the fourth Saturday of the month at 10:30am. The next date of this program will be on Saturday, July 26th at 10:30am.

- In July, join the Library for an open craft session. It will be followed by the Love on a Leash program at 11:15am.
- **Teen Gaming.** During the Summer Reading Program, this open gaming session takes place Monday-Thursday at 3:30pm for teens. Beginning on July 21st, it will return to Mondays only.
- **Teen Scene.** Teen Scene is hosted each week on Wednesday afternoons at 3:30pm for grades 6-12. Activities vary and registration is not required.
- **Teen Blush Book Club.** On the first Thursday of the month at 4pm, join us for a teen book club! Blush Book Club is an extension of our Books with Spice program for high school students. This group reads young adult (YA) romance, and meets in the large study room. The title for August 7th is *Check & Mate* by Ali Hazelwood.
